IS IT OVER? by randy bryant

The cover story of the April 13th edition of Newsweek Magazine declared the "end of a Christian Nation." The article went on to say that the percentage of people who consider our country a "Christian nation" has fallen from 71% under the Bush administration to 62% under the current administration. Coupled with that statistic were other figures offered as consideration to "prove" our country is no longer "Christian." Of course, you can use statistics to say anything you want. A recent Rasmussen Report stated that 85% of Americans believe that Jesus was indeed a historical reality and some 88% of those believe that He is the Son of God. Those figures hardly declare that our nation has completely rejected Christianity!

Recently, during a speech in Turkey, President Obama announced to the world that "America is not a Christian nation." His focus was intended to be that there are many religions in our country and we are not just specifically Christian. The sad truth of his speech was that he seemed to separate not only himself, but also our country, from the Judeo-Christian principles on which it was founded. Is it really that simple to throw out our historical roots?

The question that surfaces is: where are we and why are we here? Granted, our country does not reflect the Christian worldview it once did. We have left many of our founding principles and continue to spiral away from those truths. However, there are still millions of Americans who are Christians and Christianity remains the most popular religion in our nation. The real problem is that many of those who identify themselves as "Christian" rarely act or represent Christian beliefs.

It is tough to speak in generalities, but it seems to me that what we really need is more "Christian Christians." Christ told us Himself, "if the salt has lost its flavor, it is good for nothing." The call for today's world is more people who are real about their faith, who will live it out and fearlessly proclaim to others the hope that we have in Christ. Today's society gives us a unique opportunity to show the real difference in Christianity and all the other "beliefs" that are out there. Let's make a difference!

To paraphrase an old song, "Spring is bustin' out all over" in Nashville! What a glorious time to celebrate our Lord's resurrection. Because He lives forever, we have hope to share with the nations! Here is our good news from the past few weeks:

We have been approved to return to Cote d'Ivoire this summer, hopefully in early July! Verlin will probably precede Corbin and me by 14 days, as visas are approved.

Our account balance climbed from \$28,000 in the red and is currently hovering at around \$0. Please pray with us that a remaining \$16,000 in cash will come in before our departure date, along with an additional \$1,500 per month which, due to the money exchange rates, is necessary for us to minister effectively while in Africa.

We would like to extend a huge thank you to the people of Florida, North Carolina, Michigan, and Tennessee who welcomed us while we were visiting. People were saved, lives rededicated, and all seemed encouraged by what God is doing through Community Health Evangelism (CHE) in West Africa.

As an update, the Christian teen who was converted from a Muslim family has been stopping by our house in West Africa to attend a Bible study and prayer meeting. Praise God that the persecution from her family has lifted a bit to make this possible, however she is still not able to attend church. For her continued safety, we will refrain from using her name.

Thank you for all you do. May your family enjoy a precious season, rejoicing in our risen Savior.

We've been back in Spain now for six weeks but in some ways, it seems much longer. We have been busy renewing friendships and visiting our pastors and each of our Free Will Baptist churches here in Spain. There are many positive things happening in our churches and we are thankful for what the Lord is doing.

The construction of the Vil-



lalba church is moving right along. The inside still has a lot to be done before it is finished, but the drywall is going up, and the bathroom tiles have been added. The church itself is doing well, hosting a full house most Sundays with standing room only. This is a great problem to have and we are looking forward to when we will be in the new church building where everyone will have a seat.

The Alpedrete church has an average of 25-30 attendees each week. Missionaries Tim and Kristi Johnson and Anthony and Lea Edgmon are doing a great job facilitating the planting of this evangelical church, the very first of its kind for this 500-year-old city.

The Colmenar Viejo Church averages 20-25 people each Sunday and can boast of some recent visitors. Pastor Juan Carlos is doing a good job with this church and has a heart to reach this community for Christ.

The small congregation of 20-25 people at the Esperanza Church has recently moved into their own meeting space. It is a store-front space near the center of town. Missionaries Mick and Rachel Donahue have recently begun offering English classes and covet your prayers for their new outreach program.

Last week, we held our semi-annual Field Council meetings which we use to strategize, plan for and pray over the work here in Spain. It was wonderful to have our Regional Director, Clint Morgan, and his wife, Lynette, with us for a few days. On Saturday evening, while the women from all of our churches gathered for a "women's meeting" (our version of Women Active for Christ), Clint met with our three pastors.
