DEEP MYSTERIES OF THE CHURCH by randy bryant

Every body loves a mystery! At least that's what I've heard. Scripture makes reference to various mysteries revealed to us as believers. The mystery of Christ; the mysteries of the gospel and the mysteries of the faith are secrets that we, as believers, understand. In Scripture, mysteries have been defined as "something once hidden, now revealed." What I want to address (perhaps a bit tongue in cheek) are some mysteries of the current church, things that seem to be true which simply confuse me and leave me scratching my head in bewilderment. Maybe you can help me understand.

Here are some mysteries for which I have no answers: Why is it that your lowest church attendance in memory occurs on the days you host a guest speaker? I have experienced this scenario both as a pastor and as a guest speaker. Why is that? Is it because your people think no one can preach as well as you do, so they stay home? Maybe it's because they don't want to hear someone who preaches better than their pastor. Who knows? The only gratifying thing about this mystery is that other pastors and speakers seem to face the same dilemma.

Here are a few others I've pondered. Why is it that everyone goes to see someone else on holidays instead of coming to see the relatives in your church? I know that some churches benefit from holidays, but it's usually the opposite in the churches I've pastored. I hear others talk about huge numbers on Mother's Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas but my experience seems to be that people go to see their relatives, instead of their relatives coming to see them. And can anyone tell me why musicians who haven't practiced their song feel the need to announce that before they sing? Just sing, we can usually tell if you've practiced or not. Here's another mystery that seems to be universal. Why does the devil seem to have free access to sound systems, projectors and computers? Without fail, if there is a problem during the service, it will be through the sound system. You can have the most experienced techs in town, but that battery is going to go out on your lapel mic as soon as you start to preach, or your sound system is going to pick up more from the CB radio in the big rig passing by than it does from your sermon.

Obviously, these mysteries are not on the level of the ones mentioned in Scripture but they are certainly nerve-wracking and challenging! If someone has the answers as to why these happen, I would sure appreciate some insight. Just drop in any holiday weekend we have a guest speaker and speak right into the mic!

We were invited to meet with a group of believers last Friday night from Collado Mediano, which is where we have lived for the past three years. We met at a neighbor's home. Thinking just a few others would be there also, we were pleasantly surprised to see how many people attended this meeting. There were 21 adults and 16 children who packed into this house for their cell group meeting. This group of people has been meeting for over six years and this was simply the organizational meeting for the coming year. Many people who were there attend the FWB church in Alpedrete, but live in Collado Mediano. 
